MATH TIPS: We are continuing to work on our school goal: *To build competence in the students' ability to explain mathematical thinking*. Here are some more questions you can ask your child when they are doing math that will help them expand their thinking. (You will see that these can be used for more than just Math)

- Can you draw a picture to explain your thinking?
- Are there other possible answers/explanations?
- What could you try next?

We are encouraging our students not to 'stop' at *one* answer or *one* method. We want to develop flexible thinking when approaching math problems.
